# **Primary Care Access (PCA)**

- Enroll an estimated 78,581 adults ages 19-64 years under 100% FPL in a health home
- Pay primary care providers willing to provide primary care management services
- Providers must offer:



- > Sliding fee for services, based on income
- Access to other discounted services if available



## **Primary Care Access**

- Provides basic primary care, including an opportunity to integrate behavioral healthcare with state clinics to reduce mental health holds and jail recidivism
- County/state indigent programs must continue for "Not Covered" services outside of the Primary Care Access umbrella



# **Primary Care Access Advantages**

Idaho controls: Not health coverage nor an entitlement

program

 Reduces, but does not eliminate, costs to county and state indigent programs

- Provides access to a medical home for routine primary care & care coordination
- Provides basic coordinated and integrated behavioral health to our most vulnerable adults
- Expectation of patient accountability with sliding fee requirement
- Fewer hospitalizations due to chronic conditions
- Healthier, more productive workforce



### **Priorities to Develop An Idaho Solution**

- No federal strings: An all-Idaho product that is not an entitlement program
  - Complete control of eligibility
    - Require sliding fee/cost sharing
      - Focus on primary care, prevention and management of chronic conditions
        - Utilize private sector for services
        - Work activity requirements
        - Funded through dedicated funds



#### **Political Landscape**

- Policy makers not showing support for Healthy Idaho Plan as a viable legislative solution
- Healthy Idaho Plan would require strong grassroots support from business sector
- Governor testing legislative interest in Primary Care Access
- Both the Healthy Idaho Plan and Primary Care Access warrant a thorough discussion in the upcoming 2016 Legislative session





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
